Meet Chikku, who is six years old, extremely curious and loves learning new things. Her mind is always full of questions!




Chinnu, who is twelve years old, is Chikku's elder sister and is very concerned about the environment. She is ever so patient and is always there to clear her little sister's doubts.

Finally pour some water over the soil. Remember, you have to water the plant every day.






After the seed sprouts and starts growing, you have to water it regularly and nurture it.
